

Multi-talented performer returns to Devon for one night only

Known as the “One-Man Band from Newfoundland”, A. Frank Willis is returning to Devon for a one-night performance guaranteed to make his audience laugh.

The 43-year veteran performer will be at the Devon Community Centre Oct. 11 at 9 p.m.

It’s been a year and a half since Willis was last in Devon, and he’s stoked to be back.

“I love Devon. It is a beautiful, warm community. It keeps on drawing me back,” said Willis.

Willis’ show is ever-evolving.

“I’m always coming up with new material,” said Willis. “It’s going to be a lot of laughs and a lot of down-home, country, Irish and Celtic music.”

Some of Willis’ popular acts include *I’m My Own Grandpa*, *I Lobster and Never Flounder* and *I Used to Call Her Darlin’ (But Now I Call Her Collect.)*

Willis said his one-man show attracts a diverse audience – not just audience members from the East Coast. On Sept. 12, Willis performed to a sold out venue in Esterhazy, Sask.

“There was one Newfoundlander there and I got three standing ovations,” said Willis. “My audience varies. I guess they’re generally true Canadians who like to have a good time.”

Willis, who will perform in Athabasca the night before, loves taking the stage.

“I get a joy and a complete satisfaction out of making people happy and laughing,” said Willis.
